

WELCOME BACK!

The doors of Corpus Christi Church are finally open again. At last, we are resuming our regular mass schedule. After four months away, it is a true pleasure to find one another again, to reclaim our space and to be together to celebrate and worship.

It is our Christian duty of charity and love of neighbour to do our best to protect each other, to promote good health and to ensure that our Church continues to be a welcoming and safe place. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, **all the recommended sanitary measures have been put in place at corpus Christi for the safety of all.**

Our return to mass will therefore look a little bit different from what it did before the outbreak.

Please read through the Health and Safety Protocols on the insert pages to familiarize yourself with the new procedures.

Try to arrive early, since social distancing is required, and there may be a lineup at the entry, especially for the first few weeks, as we all become more accustomed to the new ways of doing things. The doors will be open early, and you will be able to sit and pray, or avail yourself of the chance for confession (in the hall kitchen).

We remind you to **plan ahead:**

- bring your mask and personal hand-sanitizer if would rather not use the ones offered on-site;
- go to the washroom before leaving;
- bring your own Sunday Missal or daily Missalette (Sunday Missals are available for purchase at the door);
- please prepare your offertory envelope in advance, ready to deposit in the basket near the entrance.

We are able once again to hold Baptisms, Funeral and Memorial Masses. However, we will not currently be opening the parish hall for activities during the summer. **Children’s faith formation activities will resume in the fall**, with plans to wrap up the disrupted catechetical year and hold the delayed First Communions first.

We sincerely thank everyone who continued to provide financial support to our Parish and our Pantry during this difficult time. May God bless you for your faith and generosity.

If, for health reasons, you prefer to not to return to church at this time, your Sunday obligations may be fulfilled by doing spiritual communion and by attending mass virtually if you so choose. Our Archbishop has relieved the faithful of this diocese of any obligation to be physically present for Sunday Mass on church premises, until further notice.
